

What can we do? (A short message by David Leeming)

Dear friends, I am writing this towards the end of February as I will be away for a few weeks. Today is just 1 year since Russia invaded the Ukraine. 12 months ago the Russian's expected to walk into the land but the people put up a strong defence so the conflict began. It is unimaginable the destruction that has taken place and the lives lost and also the destruction of a normal life and the despair that so many have. In Russia the people are brainwashed being told that they are defending the nation against the western world. The leaders in Russia have much to answer for. The church in Ukraine are working hard to support people and the Christians in places over the borders are providing food and shelter and homes for the displaced folk.

Over the last 2 weeks we have seen other massive destruction caused by the earthquake in Turkey and Syria. Everywhere there is loss of homes and shops and unbelievable loss of life. I was impressed by a message from Open doors telling of the work done by Christians in both Syria and Turkey. One Church in Syria has welcomed over 1000 people to live in the church where they are providing food and shelter. I trust our response in both these areas is to give what we can and remember them in our prayers.

We on the other hand need to ask ourselves what we as a church can do for the folk around us. We have the greatest treasure in the Lord Jesus Christ. He left His place in Heaven to come to earth, to live as a human being, to experience all our problems and eventually to die on a cross for our sins and then to rise triumphant over death itself, yet we are doing?

Very little to pass this message onto others. We have gone through Covid and now need to waken up to reveal our treasure to those around us. Perhaps we should start with family and friends making sure, by our actions and words, that they know the Lord. I want you to join with me to pray for 3 people close to you that they come to know the Lord. I will have some cards where you can name those you will pray for and let me have a copy. Only the two of us and the Lord will know what we are doing, please ask for a card.

I trust we will all join together this Easter in praising our Saviour for the treasure we have in Him. Have a blessed time.

Door Stewards & Service Leaders





Nothing, but believe in the efficacy of the Sacrifice Jesus made at Calvary.
