Hello from Dhaka where we are enjoying a fall in daytime temperatures to around 28 degrees and 'cool' night time temperatures of 17/18 degrees. For foreigners November to February is said to be the most productive time, as temperatures and humidity reduce and we feel much more energised. This is just as well for we have a busy three months ahead of us. Since we announced our departure date for the end of February 2017, there has been an increasing number of requests for visits, support with various projects and pieces of work which our friends here want help with before we leave. It is always the same when you move on from a place and a specific work. We are encouraged because these things indicate that we have achieved something here in Bangladesh.

We have just held a three day Leadership Conference, jointly with Precept Ministries International. This week we will have two of our BMS Directors visiting. With the departure of our Regional Team Leader in September, the Directors are coming to reassure our Bangladesh friends of the continued commitment of BMS and explore some of the potential for further development of the partnership. We shall also be attending the graduation of MA students at the college. This will be a joy, as we have seen them through their full two year course. Then follows a week when there are the scheduled round of committees within the denomination and a wedding to attend. By which time it will be almost Christmas!

We send our love and best wishes to you all as we move through Advent and on to the Christmas celebrations. We hope you have a joyful and peaceful time. For those from supporting churches, please convey our Christmas Greetings to your respective fellowships. We shall spend Christmas in Khulna, a city in the South West of the country and where our German colleagues from Liebenzell Mission live. We are looking forward to spending time with them and visiting this area.

Now our attention is also on arrangements for leaving, thinking and praying about the future. We shall continue to serve with BMS from March until the end of May and look forward to meeting churches and friends during this time. Then Andrew 'officially retires' and at this stage we have no clear indication what and where Gwen will continue to work. We value prayer for this as we have no home as such until we are clear where we might be located. We both feel this is a time for new challenges and are at peace, as well as excited about a new chapter in our lives.

Please pray for all the practicalities of finishing in Dhaka, apartment and furniture to dispose of, the many 'goodbyes' to people who have become such good friends, arrangements for freighting possessions back to the UK, flights back and the acquisition of a car. Please also pray for the continuing work here and that someone will become available to take our place and encourage the church in Bangladesh.

We plan to send our last BMS prayer letter in January and hope we can include more news then about the church and the work here. For now we send you Christmas Greetings and our best wishes for 2017.

He has a huge heart for the Muslims who come to the hospital for treatment, and he wants to bless them this Christmas. Every year, G2 hosts a Christmas celebration, and this year you can help them make it the biggest and best party yet. Your gifts can have an impact long after Christmas, too. As Pastor Djibrine prays with inpatients, he would love to be able to give those who are interested in Christianity a Bible that they can take away with them. He's also excited to now have a motorbike with which he can make home visits to patients, but he needs some fuel to get

him there.
