#### **Forgiveness** (A short message by Philip Rowland)

So often we pray these words: "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those that trespass against us". And rightly so, for we need our sins and trespasses forgiving. It's wonderful that Jesus came to call sinners to repentance – I'm sure that that includes all of us, and even more wonderful that God has wiped that slate clean.

We read in Psalm 103 that 'as far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our trespasses from us'. In God's eyes, once this has been done, no searching for them will ever find them! Going east or west, the limit of searching is never reached! Christ has bourne our sins on that cross in our place. And in God's mercy and grace, those sins can never be found again. They are not only forgiven, but they are also forgotten!

But what about 'forgiving those who trespass against us'? God is faithful and just in forgiving us our sins, for Christ in love carried them Himself in our place. But how good are we at forgiving the sins of others? How often have we said or thought "Oh! Such and such! Didn't they once...." And so, to our shame, we go on to rhyme off their catalogue of sins!

We must ever be conscious how we judge others. Do we know better than God? He is the One who has been sinned against, whose Law of love has been broken. And He has expressed Himself satisfied in all that Christ has accomplished on behalf of sinners.

Look at two Biblical saints of old. Moses was a killer, and David an adulterer and killer. Both were forgiven and used mightily of God in working out His purposes. Read the lives of many preachers and hymnwriters, and many you will see were either notorious sinners, or professed themselves Christians before they were truly born again.

Can we continue to label people for their past sins when they have found forgiveness in the Lord Jesus Christ? Let us rather praise God for His mercy towards them, and be thankful that judgement did not fall upon ourselves in the past for what we have done.

We read our Bibles, but gain no sustenance that we are aware of. I've described it as a winter experience. Some call it a wilderness experience. It's a time when we feel bad.

# **WORLDNEWS**

### LIFE AT THE EDGES



Praise God that the gospel is being shared in remote locations in Bangladesh.

Fragile communities abound across the fault lines of Bangladesh. But where the local Church has taken root in the margins of these communities, there are signs of thriving. BMS World Mission workers Louise and Peter Lynch help those who work on the edges, supporting churchbased initiatives that are transforming communities.

Louise and Peter's visits to one village, Balapara, have particularly stayed with them. Life there is marked by constant threat: the Covid-19 pandemic, natural disasters, and a state that is increasingly discriminatory towards Christians. But, as Louise explains, light still reaches in: "The church is bringing good news because it's telling people about Jesus, and therefore they've got someone to pray to and someone to hope in, which replaces hopelessness and uncertainty. But it's worth emphasising that they're not expecting God to lift them out of their poverty."

God is at work in other ways. "Some of it is just supernaturally amazing, in that God appears in dreams to people and they ask us, 'Who is this Jesus?'" Peter says. "I've met him in my dream, and I want to know who I am now going to follow.'"

Louise and Peter experienced a church "full of vibrancy and life" on their last visit. "The church is full of people, and we had such a joyful day and a good time worshipping and training, and the people feel blessed and are so grateful."

The hope of flourishing communities is what keeps Christian leaders working in villages like Balapara going. "Their hope is really that for the young people in these communities in their journey into faith, that these moments of joy stick, that this will provide a sense of belonging to the church family." Joy at the margins produces more joy. And when it does, villages like Balapara grow and thrive.
