Christmas Message from the North West Baptist Association

Dear Friend

It is hard to know where to begin our Annual letter to churches and ministers this year. None of us could have imagined the journey that 2020 has turned out to be. With recent news of an approved vaccine, hopes are perhaps lifted, but there remains a significant road to travel.

Though events have been so unexpected, I sense that this year has also served to reinforce our identity as a community of God's people. So many of our anticipated activities have had to be cancelled or significantly re-structured; physical meetings with and between churches have been almost non-existent, and yet at the same time a deep sense of community has been revealed across NWBA. Every NWBA church has been impacted, and it is thanks to the dedication and creativity of people like you, that we have not only maintained our life together, but can share stories of new initiatives, connections and possibilities that have emerged.

It has been humbling to be part of that, with many messages of support and genuine appreciation as we cobbled together online services and reflections - learning as we went along how to use the many features of our computers of which we were previously unaware. For all its unexpectedness, this has created new opportunities to connect with and include people, and a key challenge is how we use these new skills and technologies to serve each other in mission and ministry even more. Our shared identity is much more than financial, yet it is perhaps a sign of its depth and reality, that giving to Baptist Home Mission from NWBA churches has exceeded its set target for 2020. We are deeply grateful for this practical expression of our shared commitment to one another.

While we can celebrate these genuine signs of hope, we recognise too that this has been a year of tragedy and struggle for many. Our North West Region has been hit particularly hard and we ourselves have not been immune to that. Members of NWBA churches have died, and many others have struggled with issues of isolation, loneliness, financial hardship and insecurity. At one NWBA Team Meeting during the first lockdown, as stories were shared, virtually every headline issue had impacted someone present in one way or another - this is a reality that can probably be repeated right across our NWBA community.

It feels almost reckless to imagine that 2021 might signal a return to something of normality, but we sense that this might yet be the case. This will bring its own challenges as we face no less of a transition out of a life that has been defined by restriction and lockdown, as we faced when we entered it. We will need time to take stock, re-set our vision and of course carefully consider what we might have learned as a community of God's people through this worldwide pandemic.

2021 is unlikely to be a year for introducing great new initiatives and projects, but rather to carefully and prayerfully listen to God and to one another as we discern our way forward. It is this that has led us to identify the core theme for our work in 2021 as 'ROOTED". This emerged from one of our online reflections in late November based on the words of Jesus "I am the Vine... remain in me". [John 15:5]

The road ahead remains unclear and will no doubt still contain its challenges. Yet this is a time of year when we follow a vulnerable couple on their journey to Bethlehem in the face of overwhelming struggle and uncertainty. Yet they did so with faithful confidence that

they were rooted in God's purposes and surrounded by God's love. Very often the difference between hope and despair is not so much the circumstances that we face but the way we understand them. Whatever we have endured and whatever is yet required of us, we are a people whose faith is rooted in Christ and whose shared foundation as the people of God can sustain us through this troubling journey.

This season will bring its own challenges, but on behalf of the NWBA team we offer our prayers and good wishes that it will for you and your church community prove to be a blessed and peaceful experience.
