

Philippians 3 v 13-14 – Forgetting what is behind and straining to what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.

We are facing a New Year and we know not what its days and months might bring. For all of us to some extent the last year has been difficult; in the life of the nation, the Church and in our own personal lives. Now Paul writes to the Philippians about forgiving the past, after all it is seldom possible to put past things right, and Paul's advice is to forget (perhaps learn the lessons) but to move on, forward press towards the goal – seeing Jesus and with Him we can have a bright future.

In many respects the same problems have to be faced in the Church, in our nation and in our personal lives. This may involve the pain that does not go away, the heartache which has to be endured or the prayer that does not seem to be answered. But by looking to Jesus, letting Him deal with the situations we can take courage and experience new hope and confidently affirm "our lives are in His hand."

Those to whom Paul wrote were not having an easy time. Family and friends were trying to win them back to the Jewish faith. The religious authorities hated Jesus Christ and those who followed Him. The national leaders were doing all they could to stamp out the Christian Faith.

None of these things were to bother first century Christians. They had Jesus and went forward with Him. We too can trust Him and in Him all will be well.

Through the love of Christ our Saviour, all will be well.
Free and changeless is His favour, and all is well.
Precious is the blood that saved us,
precious is the grace that keeps us,
strong the hand stretched out to save us. All must be well.

Though we pass through tribulation all will be well.
Ours is such a full salvation, all, all is well.
Happy still in God confiding.
Peaceful, if in Christ abiding.
Holy through the spirit guiding, all, all is well.

We expect a bright tomorrow, all, all is well.
Faith can sing through days of sorrow, all, all is well.


Re-Dedication Service - Sunday 1st January, 2023 - 10.30 a.m.

The Bible was written by God, using many authors from all sorts of backgrounds, having many different jobs. God tells us the story of his nation Israel and His son, Jesus Christ, making sure it has been preserved for us through the ages for us to read today.

The Bible outlines the right way to lead our lives, as well as containing many historical accounts. Moses led Israel through the Red Sea, at the battle of Jericho trumpeters marched round the walls for seven days, Judea saw great wars and captivity, Abishag gained David as a husband, the Pharisees would act superior to everyone else, perhaps almsgiving for example, but Jesus kept giving them a most stern rebuke. Jesus also performed many miracles, after receiving the Holy Spirit upon his baptismal achievement, with his first miracle being turning the water into wine for the groom at the wedding, maybe it was a nice Spanish Rioja? Mesopotamia was an important region in Biblical history, with Ur and Babylon in that area, as was Sudan Lelsewhere read.

When studying the Bible it is helpful to look out for any Bible echo. Search for them whenever you read as you will see some fascinating things, particularly when reading the letters to the various churches, or ecclesias. Testing what you hear against the Bible is also very important to show if it is true, for example if someone suggests Jesus was born in Suez rather than Bethlehem, you would use the Bible to check its accuracy. The same applies if you think Paul ate locusts, David played a banjo eloquently for Saul, Barnabas went on missionary work to Dijon, a horse carried Jesus into Jerusalem or Lazarus died of swine flu, keep going back to the Bible as you can learn a lot from answers to your questions. There is no need to put being academic ahead of everything else though as Jesus said it is most important to love one another, in a humble spirit. Jesus gave his life for us and when we are in a spiritual rut, his love will give us the comfort we need.







Prayer Matters



- And that we will listen and obey as He speaks to us through it, through the Living Word made Flesh, Jesus the Lord.



Esther – and her banana plants – are so thankful for your support!

"The land is tired and less fertile. I think we need to learn new methods of farming."


Esther is 59 years old. She's widowed and relies on farming to provide for the seven children in her care. She often worries about missing the right window for planting her crops as she has to till all her land by hand, using a hoe to open up the soil. It's backbreaking work. And changes in weather resulting from climate change are making things harder than ever.

"There are more dry spells these days, and flooding in the rainy season compared to the past when rain was well distributed throughout the year," says Esther. Things are tough, but thanks to your support, Esther is working with BMS worker Genesis Acaye so she can produce a bountiful harvest.

Since participating in a BMS-supported agroforestry project in 2016, Esther's planted rice, groundnuts, cassava and banana. She's especially proud of her banana garden, and is still using her banana plants to feed her family and support them financially. She's also been able to sell the fruits and plant

offshoots to other farmers who want to grow bananas. She's noticed lots more people becoming interested after seeing how a banana garden can be managed sustainably year on year and welcomes regular visitors who want to learn about growing and managing their own garden.

"Every week, I get money from the sale of bananas from my garden and this has helped a lot in feeding, farming and paying school fees, medical bills and others," she says. "I thank UK Christians for their support. It has been a great help to us and may the Lord bless you."
