

Shields of Faith (A short message by Nigel Leeming)

In Wellingtons army solders used a square formation when faced with Calvary. They formed four sides with baronets fixed and usually two rows of solders with the guns facing out and the front ranks wedging their musket and rifle butts into the ground. When working together this formation gave an impenetrable barrier to the horse mounted enemy. Behind the muskets was a refuge for the injured and weary soldier.

The Viking faced their enemy with a Shield wall. Shields interlocked relying on the person on their right-hand side to cut down the person in front of them. The Romans too followed similar tactics and developed their short sword for such battles. This is what Paul was writing about to the Ephesians 6

¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. ¹¹ Put on the full armour of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. ¹² For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. ¹³ Therefore put on the full Armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. ¹⁴ Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, ¹⁵ and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. ¹⁷ Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

¹⁸ And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people.

These past few weeks we feel as a fellowship to have been under attack. There are still matters to resolve and we pray for the Lord's guidance in these and hopefully all, matters. But let's interlock our shields of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one.

There will not be an evening service in July or August, the next will be held on the 10th September, Leader TBC.




We are still looking for people to be Door Stewards & Service Leaders to support these two important activities here in the church. If you would be able to help with either or both, please contact Mark for more details.




Do Not Worry (Bird & Lilies) Matthew 6:24-33 NIV

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life? "And why do you worry about clothes? See how the lilies of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.


Paul wrote to the Thessalonian church and urged them to "Pray without ceasing". 1 Thessalonians chapter 5 verse 17.

You may have seen fundraising legend Kenneth Hall, featured in Issue 51 of Engage, the BMS World Mission magazine, in 2021. Kenneth rowed a whopping 400 miles on his rowing machine at home, over the course of three days, raising over £13,000 for an X-ray facility for Bardaï hospital in Chad. Kenneth chose that distance because that's how far away the nearest X-ray facility is from Bardaï. Well, it was that far away.

Just before Christmas (and after a muchdelayed flight), a printer weighing almost 20 stone, a desktop computer, the X-ray cassette reader, a nurse ready to be trained and a pilot, Phil, who blessedly doubled up as an electrician, touched down safely in Bardaï. Phil and Onésime, the technician, set about fixing the temperamental electrics at the hospital in preparation for the installation of this vital piece of equipment.

After a two-week course led by an experienced radiographer from N'Djamena, the first ever X-ray at Bardaï hospital came back crystal clear! Since then, life has been busy for everyone at the hospital. Such is the radical nature of the new machine, it seems anyone with

any pain turns up at the hospital to be X-rayed (and are often gently turned down). But such inconveniences are worth it when set against the dozens of necessary X-rays performed! And especially worth it in the case of one young boy who was brought to the hospital exhibiting symptoms of tuberculosis (TB). In the past, the only options open to the medical team in these circumstances were a risky biopsy under anaesthetic or a hazardous 400mile trip to the nearest X-ray machine. Now, the diagnosis of TB is risk-free and rapid – and meant this young boy could start treatment that same day.

This is a wonderful example of how God can work in and through an individual, supported by others, to bless a whole community.

We've been hearing from our brothers and sisters in Paris about what trusting in Christ means for them. We spoke to some

of the church family at the fellowship run there by BMS World Mission workers, John and Sue Wilson. Here is Silvère's story:

"The first church I went to was this church, but I don't really remember because I was just a kid! But then I moved to French Guiana with my parents, and when I came back to Paris with my mother, we went to a Catholic Church.

"When my parents got divorced, my mother became a Protestant and we went to a community church, and my sister started going to a charismatic church. She told me to go too, but at the time I was 18 years old, and when you're 18, nobody can tell you to go to church if you don't want to go! So I would only go to church about once a month.

"I started going to church again when I studied for a year in America, and then when I came back to Paris, I wanted to get baptised. I came to this church in 2016 and the third time I came, I was about to leave but at the end of the service, John said that the people who want to get baptised should come and see him. And I went.



"That's where my journey started with Jesus. Before that, I believed in Jesus, I used to go to church, but it was like Santa Claus for me. When I asked to get baptised, this was the start of my journey.

"Now, I'm a member of the church council, I'm one of the youth leaders and I help manage the worship band. I almost never say no when it comes to God!"
