

Prayer Matters

THERE IS LOVE HERE



Jimmy and Phionah followed God's call to minister to students in Gulu.

There is love here. That's the overwhelming impression you'll get upon entering University Community Church (UCC), in Gulu, Uganda, and being welcomed by the congregation and church leaders, Jimmy and Phionah Okello.

Eight years after being called to plant a church in northern Uganda, they've built a warm, strong community at UCC – but ministering to students isn't without its challenges. "It's so transient and it can be discouraging," explains Phionah. "Because every three years almost half of the church is gone and you have different people." But despite the impermanence of the context they're in, they're able to offer a safe space for these young people experiencing a huge change in their lives.

Many churches in the UK struggle to engage with young people, but Jimmy

and Phionah don't have a secret formula when it comes to their student ministry. They simply spend their time building strong relationships, and are available to help whenever they can. "If you build a relationship of trust, [the students] can listen to you and bring their issues to you," Jimmy explains. It's a principle Jimmy and Phionah also take to their work outside of UCC with BMS' partner Justice Livelihoods Health, where Phionah helps with administration and finance, and Jimmy runs outreach and training for local church leaders. "I get the opportunity to share some of my skills and abilities in leadership, which I use at UCC, to equip other pastors in different churches," says Jimmy. "Being able to share with them from what I have so that they're able to lead more effectively and be equipped is really a beautiful thing."

There is love here. Not just at UCC, but in this community, in this city. It's proof that, with God's unfailing love abounding, any life can be lived with abundance.

Thank you for helping transform Hari's life!

Imagine being a carpenter from Nepal, and relying on the strength of your limbs to carve heavy furniture or move planks of wood. Then imagine one day noticing the toes in your right leg swelling, before experiencing a burning pain throughout your leg. That was the situation Hari Thapa found himself in – and knowing that his family of five were relying on him, he sought medical treatment right away. But after visiting various health institutions and trying different medicines, all Hari was left with were vast bills, with no improvement to his leg.

One April, Hari tried once more to get a diagnosis, and visited BMS-supported Green Pastures Hospital for treatment. He was finally given a diagnosis of leprosy and prescribed effective medicine, but after experiencing side-effects, Hari quickly discontinued the treatment.

It wasn't until Hari met Tham, a BMSsupported pastoral counsellor who had recovered from leprosy himself, that Hari felt confident enough to restart his treatment.

By this time, he had ulcers on both legs which needed surgery and further care. Sessions with Tham have reassured Hari that his medicine is working, and have helped him process his regret at not continuing his treatment sooner. "Now he is happy and he said that his health is improving and he has learned self-care skills for his ulcer care," say the team at Green Pastures. Thank you for being there for Hari and for enabling Tham to do his important work, too.
