

As most will know over the next few months, we are planning to appoint a new church secretary and others to take on the jobs I have been doing. We also are considering appointing additional Deacons and considering if we should appoint more Elders. This means that when we meet on the 14th March for a church meeting we need to be well prepared.

All church members should realise how important the changes for the future are and should be present, other members of the congregation are very welcome and can make a valuable contribution by showing their support.

My attention was drawn to Acts 13 v1-7 in my daily Bible Reading; I would suggest we all read this passage in preparation for the meeting.

In this passage the early church is about to send someone on a potentially dangerous enterprise, The two chosen are Paul and Barnabus. We must first note that they are very much part of their Christian Community and we should especially note that the initiative came from the Holy Spirit speaking to the gathered church, not to Paul and Barnabus individually.

Look what the church is doing, the whole community is worshipping, praying and fasting. This fact is repeated and note there is no record of long debates and committees meeting. That may have happened, I don't know, but Luke the writer of Acts chooses to emphasise the costly commitment to prayer (v3).

Please also note that the early church was looking to the Holy Spirit to make His will known.

I want to ask YOU a question... How are you personally preparing to help our church make these big decisions? Do we need to revise our way of going about it? Are you looking to the Holy Spirit and spending time in Prayer and worship? I do hope we all are.

No one knows how much you give unless you gift aid (we do have to know to reclaim tax but this is known by only two people). So please consider joining the scheme.

Finally, I do not need to tell you that repairs are expensive and much work is required please give what you can for the Lord's Work.

Gwen will complete the teaching of the Spiritual Formation course for the B.Th students at CCTB [College of Christian Theology Bangladesh] this coming Thursday. Having just returned from the north of the country where we attended a District Revival Meeting 'boro shova' In Rangpur, this coming week end will see us journey to the south for another gathering, this time in the Barisal and Gopalganj Districts.

Rangpur is very special to us for this is where our good friend Barnabas Hembrom is located and it was sad to say our farewells to him and the folks there. We shall have to go through the 'good byes' on numerous occasions over the next week or so, these are particularly draining emotionally. We have packed our bags several times to see what we can manage within the weight limit but every time we go to a farewell or last meeting, we get another gift. We feel very blessed by the expressions of appreciation and invitations to return to visit.

I am busily seeking to complete items of work and write up information for our hoped for replacements. There is nothing definite as yet but a couple are interested in pursuing the possibility of coming to Dhaka. This will be important as having someone in the country is both valuable for BMS but even more appreciated by the Bangladesh Baptist Church. Please pray that this will all work out in God's good timing and that the work will go on from strength to strength.

Although sad to be leaving people here we are looking forward to seeing family and friends. We shall continue to serve with BMS until the end of May and during this time will be able to visit some of our supporting churches and perhaps make some informal visit s to other people and places. We are also planning to attend the Baptist Assembly being held in Harrogate in May. We would value your prayers as we do not know what will be next for us. We plan to take a little time to reflect on our experiences and whilst I move into 'retirement mode' Gwen is keeping an open mind about what she might feel is right for her continued ministry.

We value your friendship, interest and prayers. Thank you for sharing the journey with us in what has been both a challenging and rewarding experience, for which we give thanks to God. We will definitely be seeing some of you soon.

# **Prayer Matters:**

In Matthew 8, v5ff, we have the story of the Centurion asking Jesus for help. We may have been praying for this, that, and the other, but have we been specific, like the Centurion was when he approached Jesus for help?

We have perhaps identified our need. How do we pray about it to God the Father? Is it just, 'Bless me in all things?' Such a vague indication would do us no good if we went into a shop to buy something. We



need to be specific. The Centurion was specific. He knew his need (his paralysed servant, whom he thought a lot of, was desperately ill). So he specifically asked Jesus to heal him. Added to that, he had faith that Jesus could heal, even from a long distance away.

When God seems far removed from us and our petitions, do we have faith that He can and will answer us? So as we pray, let us not only pray with faith, be specific about our needs, but also trust Him to answer our petitions as He has promised to do.

#### Let's pray that

- God will guide us as we make decisions about the future organising of our Church;
- That as we consider additional Deacons, and possibly even Elders, the Lord will show us in a definite way who He wants to fill the positions in our church in the future .

#### Please also pray for:

- Our Missionary Contacts Irene, The Millns (as they enter their well-earned retirement, Rachel, and Natalie;
- That our Church will grow both in numbers and grace as the Lord adds to our number .
