

MEET ABER



Aber* is a bright and hard-working 13-year-old girl, excelling at school and with incredible potential. But all that was about to change.

During Uganda's first Covid-19 lockdown, BMS World Mission-supported child protection officer Valerie was contacted by Aber's head teacher. He said Aber's family were in the process of arranging a marriage for her, so they could secure some income. "It's not legal," says Valerie, "but it's as if it's legal, it's done so much. The man would be much older, and already have two or three wives."

Valerie immediately brought a lawyer to Aber's home, who explained that she must go back to school. Valerie then worked with her contacts – local counsellors, the headmaster and others – to make sure she could stay there. Her head teacher even said she didn't have to pay school fees. Aber is now back in class – and is one of the most successful students in the school.
