## Do you ever get discouraged? Are you tempted to lose heart? Do you have doubts?

We are aware of many in our Church family are experiencing difficulties due to the loss of loved ones, illness, daily pressures and workloads many are facing in these difficult times.

If you are having such thoughts, you are not alone. We have seen at recent Bible studies how even John the Baptist had his doubts about Christ when faced with the difficulties of imprisonment. Paul too was almost certainly tempted to lose heart, and we are aware he wrote to other Christians who were also tempted to do so. Paul wrote" We do not lose heart" (2 Corinthians 4:1,16). If you look on line at the Message translation of the Bible we see an interesting line in v1 "We do not throw up our hands and walk off the Job"

Why not? Well Paul explains that it is because in Jesus we have received a "treasure" (v.7) This treasure is the message of Jesus Christ. It is because the message Paul has to proclaim is so amazing that he starts and ends by saying, "Therefore...... we do not lose heart". This treasure is inward and unseen. Paul describes it as being in "Jars of Clay (v.7).

Our culture is based on / emphasises the outward and the seen. Our media is dominated by physical beauty and outward success. The bible stresses the importance of the inward and the unseen. Our beliefs, thoughts and attitudes that determine our outward behaviour. Look at v.18 "for what is seen is temporary and what is unseen is eternal.

If you do have doubts / failings, it is because we are but Jars of Clay. But this lent and Easter let's consider this treasure, lets seek Jesus in our thoughts, our personal study and remember what he did for each of us on the cross.

Let's remember our sin creates a barrier between us and God but thanks to the actions of Jesus that first Easter this barrier, along with the curtain in the temple, were ripped apart from top to bottom

Let's praise God for the Hope this gives us even in the most difficult times of our lives







### **Prayer Matters**

As we enter the season of Lent, (started 22nd February) we begin to think about all that Jesus accomplished for us on the cross. We call this season Lent, which is a period of 40 days during which we Christians remember especially the events leading up to and including the death of our Lord, where He bore our sins upon His sinless self so that we might be reconciled to God the Father and presented blameless in His sight. This period is called Lent after an old English word meaning 'lengthen', presumably because it is the time of year when days become noticeably longer.

Now that the days are getting longer, let's 'lend' some more time to the Lord as we meditate upon all that He has done for us. We may repent of our sins, but still we are stained and unable to approach the Holy Father, to whom we address our prayers. Without His intervention and help we would be utterly lost after death. It is only as we trust in all that Christ has done, and accept the forgiveness that He offers, that we have any hope of entering heaven.

Not for nothing is Easter called the Hinge of History.

#### Let's pray

- Putting our trust in the Lord Jesus Christ and Him alone for our salvation.
- That all our family and friends will in time put their trust in Christ as our prayers for them are answered.

#### HISTORY-MAKING MISSION



BMS workers Pete and Lou make mission history with Pastors Nandita and Jyoti!

In November 2022, the Bangladesh Baptist Church Sangha (BBCS) gathered to mark the 225-year anniversary of BMS World Mission founder William Carey's arrival in Bengal. More than 3,000 Bangladeshi Baptists came together to celebrate this milestone, along with BMS General Director Kang-San Tan, Head of BMS Trustees Marc Owen, and BMS workers Louise and Peter Lynch.

The theme chosen for the anniversary was Revelation 2: 25, which looks towards our future hope as believers: "...hold on to what you have been given until I come." As Louise explained, "The whole idea of the celebration is to go forward, looking into how we can share the gospel even more successfully across Bangladesh!" A hugely exciting part of this for BBCS was the work Louise and Peter have been doing behind the scenes with BBCS to prepare the way for the ordination of their first female pastors, Jyoti Ratner and Nandita Sharkar! As the Lynches shared in their November prayer letter:

"Jyoti and Nandita are our friends and we have seen their patient service irrespective of recognition. So, it has been really good to have been part of the behind-the-scenes team within BBCS working towards this day, and to pray for these women as they develop, train and support the next generation. The very public inclusion and affirmation of these women also, I think, communicated something about how BBCS leadership wants to be."

225 years on, our understanding of mission has changed and so has the church in Bangladesh. As Kang-San put it, "Jesus Christ's sacrifice is available for all, young and old, female and male to participate fully in the leadership of the church."
