# Let's Pray with Passion Together (A short message by Nigel Leeming)

Government changes, talk of further financial hardships pressures on our health organisations. It's currently a difficult road for many. Many are anxious for the future.

It's important we remember Prayer should be the root and fountain of all we do as a Christian family and individually. I know many pray alone for our Church and individuals and the prayer chain is proven to be an essential tool in our fellowship.

In the Bible we are reminded regularly how Christ regularly took time out to pray and how essential it was to his time he on earth. This has been continued by the Church. It is essential that we spend time with God even in (or more correctly especially in) the darkest times of our lives.

Look at Acts 12. The early Church was being actively persecuted. Herod had killed James the brother of John by the sword and in vs 3 we see Peter is arrested. The outcome for Peter and the early Church looked bleak.

What would you / we / I do faced with such seemingly impossible circumstances? In verse 5 we see what the early Church did - they undertook "earnest prayer for him (Peter)"

Let's seek Gods help as we face up to life moving forward.

#### Praying to God

Prayer to God means having an audience with God. It means actually coming into the presence of God – asking and receiving.

# Let's make use of the prayer meetings and future Sunday evening and mid-week activities

In Acts 12 'The church' (v.5) joined together in prayer. 'Many people had gathered and were praying' (v.12). The New Testament teaches a lot about private prayer, but there is even more about praying together. We encourage everyone to join us in these activities.

#### Let's follow the Example of the Early Church

There are two reasons in Acts 12 why the early Church might not have prayed at all. First, James had been executed (v.2). God had not answered their prayers for James; we don't know why. But it did not stop them praying.

You think times are bleak read Act 12. 'This chapter opens with James dead, Peter in prison and Herod triumphing; it closes with Herod dead, Peter free and the word of God triumphing.'

Times may be bleak, but nothing is impossible for God

I wonder what the Apostle Paul would write to us if he were writing today? Would it be those words in Hebrews 10, v25 "let us not give up meeting together"? From time to time, I introduce subjects for prayer, some personal, and some national. Today, I bring before you our church.

It is a matter of plain observation that our morning congregations have dwindled lately. I am not one for counting 'bottoms on seats', but over the last few Sundays we have been barely getting one third of the number (if I can count right!) we had gathering before Covid struck. Indeed, we have not many more than we were getting at the night services, when we were wondering how much longer we could continue with them.

So I extend a great thank-you to those who loyally come week by week to meet in their Lord's House, where blessings are to be found. And I know that some feel they cannot come now and so watch at home; but I urge you all to consider your position and to come along and join in our worship and fellowship, seeking fresh blessings from the Lord God, who has said, "Come unto Me!" Let us join together as God's people in Brierfield.

For Mahmoud\*, news of the war in Ukraine reminded him of his family's experience fleeing the Syrian capital Aleppo in 2013, narrowly escaping a life-threatening interrogation from violent ISIS soldiers. Mahmoud knew what hardships Ukrainians were going through and was genuinely pleased to see them being so well looked after by their European neighbours. But for every Ukrainian person he saw being welcomed, he could think of many Syrian families who had been rejected and discriminated against as they tried to find safety. He also saw the costs of living in his new home country of Lebanon skyrocketing as a direct result of the invasion.

Mahmoud's family have had to limit their electricity usage, switch off their internet connection and have stopped buying fruit, dairy products and meat in order to make ends meet. "I already had trouble providing for my wife and three children," Mahmoud says. "The increase in prices has become very hard to live with."

The family's one lifeline has been a BMS World Mission-supported learning centre that Mahmoud's children have attended since arriving in Lebanon. Mahmoud describes it as the only safe haven his children have experienced since leaving Syria. At the learning centre, they are safe and cared for. "They feel valued and they love their teachers dearly," Mahmoud continues. "They tell me they wouldn't mind being there all day from morning to night!"

Life may not be easy for Mahmoud and his family. But there are things that give them hope: the learning centre, the food vouchers they receive through BMS' partner, and most of all, their faith in God. "We believe in Jesus Christ, and we hope that what's happening and what's coming is all for the best," says Mahmoud. "Jesus does not give up on us."
