## **Memories**

#### (A short message by Donald Leeming)

As the nights draw in and the days get shorter it's good to recall summer days and holidays.

My parents and I had a number of holidays at Saltburn on the east coast, 17 miles north of Whitby. A favourite trip out was to Fountains Abbey & Ripon. We always seemed to have a lovely early autumn day over the North Yorkshire Moors, heather covered. With a detour to Ralph Cross for a hymn and a prayer, and then onto Fountains for a guided tour (claimed by some to be the finest in Europe) & have our packed lunches at the Studly Royal Picnic Site; then off to Ripon to spend the afternoon there. There was a great deal to do – optional visit to the Cathedral, sitting in the splendid gardens where often there was a military band playing from nearby Catterick, visit the shops and explore the quaint old streets and buildings.

One of the quaintest buildings is the Wakemans house, or Town Hall. It was built in 1799 and between the first floor windows and roof there is an inscription which reads "Except ye Lord. Keep ye cittie Ye Wakeman waketh in vain" taken from the Geneva Bible, part of Psalm 127 v1 which to me reads Except the Lord, keep the city the watchmen waketh but in vain.

Those who built in 1799 believed in the necessity of committing to the Lord the safety of their town and its inhabitants, and that with all the guarding they could sustain, if the Lord was not present to sustain their labours would be in vain.

As far as I know the building is not open to the public, but what a message we have. As a nation we have had one problem after another – yet there is no seeming desire to seek the blessing of the Lord. Sadly, letters to the government and even the Queen are no longer acknowledged, let alone acted upon. How we need the Lord to bless us, guide us and revive us in these days.

Another thought of Ripon each evening at dusk the wakeman dons a three cornered hat and blows a horn warning people of the coming dangers of the night. How we need to be sure that we have come to Jesus and know His protection and guidance in our lives at all times.

Near the cathedral there is, or used to be, a delightful tea shop which serves smashing cream teas where we finished the day out, and then it was back over the heather covered moors.

May the Lord yet keep our nation and ourselves in His love and protection.

Treasurer **James Townsend** celebrates the life-transforming projects funded by six decades of donations and gifts

#### It all adds up! D + G + P = T

2021 is Operation Agri's 60th Anniversary year! The charity celebrates its 60th year supporting projects in Asia, Africa, and South America. That's 15 projects in ten countries on three continents!

A conservative estimate is that gifts and donations of over £8 million have been given to Operation Agri towards projects to transform the lives of thousands of people over the years, (men, women, and children), through the work of Operation Agri and our in-country partners.

Projects from the earliest of days in the 60's include shipping day-old chicks overseas, the training of farmers in new ways to increase their yields and move them from subsistence farming, and educating women and children in life and vocational skills, and healthcare in the community. All of which sum up to the transformation of so many lives, over six decades.

#### A challenge and a thank you

2020 was a challenging year, due of course to the pandemic, but we were especially encouraged that income amounted to £150,000 for the year ending 31st October 2020 compared with £152,000 for the same period in 2019. An enormous thank you to all who supported and gifted to Operation Agri during such a difficult year.

Grants to the projects in 2020 amounted to £149,000 – an amazing accomplishment compared with £152,000 grants in 2019.
